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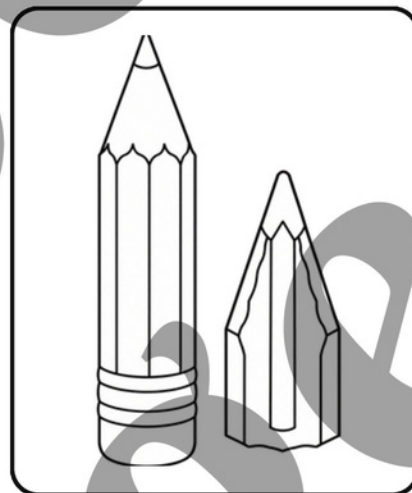
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How Does a Pencil Write?

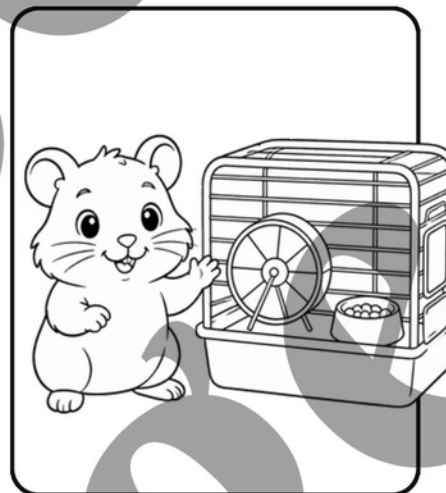
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Our New Class Pet

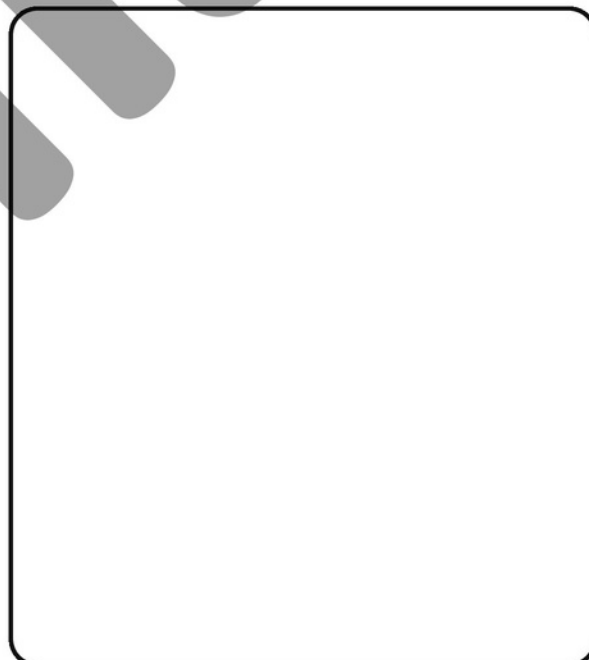

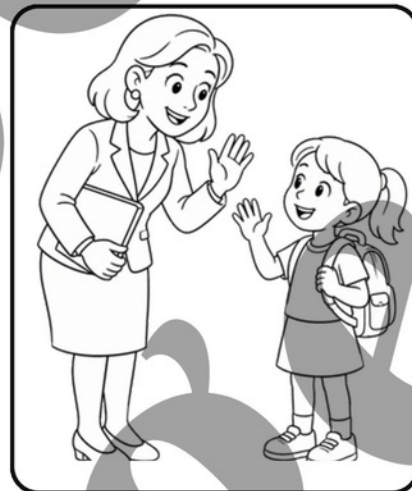
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What Does a Principal Do?

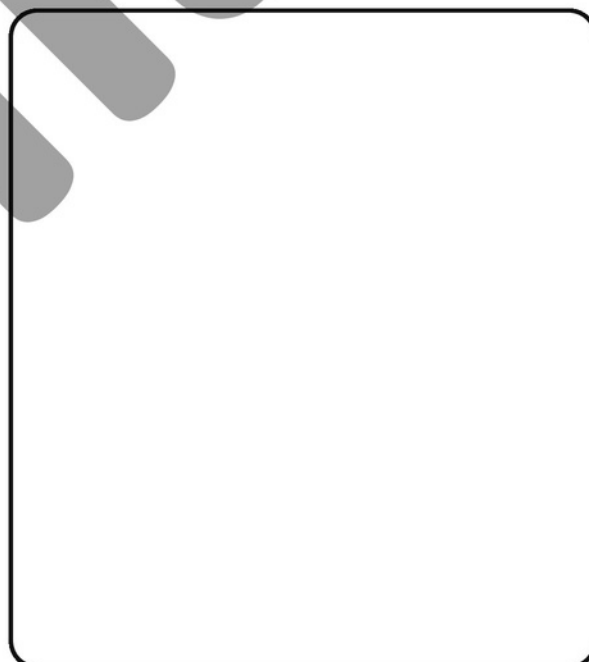
