OCTAVIO PAZ

Read the biography of Octavio Paz and answer the comprehension questions using the passage for reference.



Octavio Paz (March 31, 1914 – April 19, 1998) was a Mexican poet, essayist, and diplomat who became one of the most influential literary voices of the 20th century. Born in Mexico, Paz grew up in an intellectual and political family environment that nurtured his love of literature. He published his first collection of poems, *Unanimitas*, in 1933, at the age of 19, establishing himself as a promising young writer.

Paz's work is known for its exploration of themes such as love, identity, solitude, and the complexity of Mexican culture. His 1950 essay *El laberinto de la soledad* (The Labyrinth of Solitude) is considered one of the most important studies of Mexican identity, examining history, psychology, and cultural traditions. His poetry often combined modernist techniques with reflections on spirituality, politics, and the human condition.

In addition to his literary career, Paz served as a diplomat for Mexico in several countries, including France, India, and Japan. His time abroad exposed him to diverse cultures and philosophies, which deepened his writing and expanded his global influence. However, in 1968, he resigned from his diplomatic post in protest over the Mexican government's violent repression of student demonstrations at Tlatelolco.

Over his lifetime, Paz received numerous awards, the most prestigious being the Nobel Prize in Literature in 1982, making him the first Mexican writer to earn this honor. He is remembered not only as a poet but also as a thinker who bridged cultures, languages, and ideas. Octavio Paz's legacy endures as a symbol of intellectual independence and literary brilliance.
