CESAR CHAVEZ

Read the biography of Cesar Chavez and answer the comprehension questions using the passage for reference.



Cesar Chavez (1927 - 1993) was born in Yuma, Arizona, to a family of Mexican-American farm workers. Growing up, Cesar worked in the fields with his family, experiencing the hard life of migrant farm workers. Despite having to move frequently and work long hours, he was determined to make a difference.

Cesar believed that all farm workers should be treated fairly and with respect. In 1962, he co-founded the National Farm Workers Association, which later became the United Farm Workers (UFW).
