W.E.B. DU BOIS

Read the biography of W.E.B. Du Bois and answer the comprehension questions using the passage for reference.



W.E.B. Du Bois (1868–1963) was a famous African American writer, teacher, and activist who worked tirelessly for equal rights. He was born in Great Barrington, Massachusetts, to a family that believed strongly in the power of education. As a young boy, W.E.B. loved reading and learning, and his teachers encouraged him to set big goals. His dedication to school helped him grow into a brilliant thinker who wanted to make the world a better place.

When W.E.B. grew up, he made history as the first African American to earn a Ph.D. from Harvard University in 1895. He studied history and wrote about the ways racism harmed people and kept them from achieving their dreams. W.E.B. believed that education was the key to fighting injustice, and he spent his life working to help others understand why equality was so important.

W.E.B. Du Bois helped start an important group called the NAACP (National Association for the Advancement of Colored People) in 1909. This organization worked to protect the rights of African Americans and fight against unfair laws and segregation. Before that, he co-founded the Niagara Movement in 1905, which encouraged people to demand justice and fairness. W.E.B. wrote many books and gave powerful speeches to inspire people to stand up for what was right.

Later in life, W.E.B. moved to Ghana, a country in Africa, where he continued his work to bring people together and support freedom for all. Even in his final years, W.E.B. was committed to justice. He passed away in 1963, but his life and work left a lasting impact. W.E.B. Du Bois's story teaches us the importance of learning, determination, and standing up for what is right. He is remembered as a leader who fought for justice and inspired people around the world to dream of a better future.
