LINCOLN ALEXANDER

Read the biography of Lincoln Alexander and answer the comprehension questions using the passage for reference.



Lincoln Alexander was a trailblazer and leader who worked hard to make Canada a better and fairer place. He was born on January 21, 1922, in Toronto, Ontario, and grew up during a time when Black Canadians faced many challenges because of racism. But Lincoln never gave up and became a role model for many people, showing that anything is possible with hard work and determination.

During World War II, Lincoln served in the Royal Canadian Air Force, where he worked as a wireless operator to help protect Canada. After the war, he went to school, earning a law degree, and became a lawyer because he wanted to solve problems and fight for fairness. In 1968, Lincoln made history by becoming the first Black Member of Parliament in Canada, representing the Hamilton West riding. In 1979, he worked to change laws and policies that harmed people of color. In 1985, he made history again by becoming the first Black Lieutenant Governor of Ontario, where he represented the Queen and focused on education, youth programs, and equal opportunities for all.

Lincoln believed that education was the key to success, and he encouraged young people to work hard and follow their dreams. Over his lifetime, he received many awards and honors for breaking barriers and standing up for equality. He passed away on October 19, 2012, but his legacy continues to inspire people across Canada.
