# LINCOLN ALEXANDER

Read the biography of Lincoln Alexander and answer the comprehension questions using the passage for reference.



Lincoln Alexander was a trailblazer and an advocate for equality, who played a significant role in shaping Canada's history. Born on January 21, 1912, in Toronto, Ontario, he grew up during a time of widespread racism, which created significant barriers for Black Canadians. Despite these challenges, Alexander's determination and leadership set him apart, making him a role model for generations.

During World War II, Alexander joined the Royal Canadian Air Force, serving as a wireless operator and one of the few Black servicemen at the time. After the war, he pursued further education, graduating with a law degree from Osgoode Hall Law School in 1947. He became a practicing lawyer and dedicated his career to fighting for fairness and opportunity for all. In 1968, Alexander made history as the first Black Member of Parliament in Canada, representing Hamilton. His efforts earned him numerous honors, including being named a Companion of the Order of Canada, the country's highest civilian honor. After his passing on October 19, 2012, his contributions continued to be celebrated, including the establishment of Lincoln Alexander Day on January 21, recognized annually in Ontario to honor his remarkable legacy.
