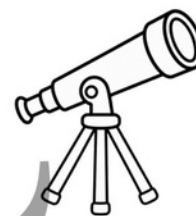

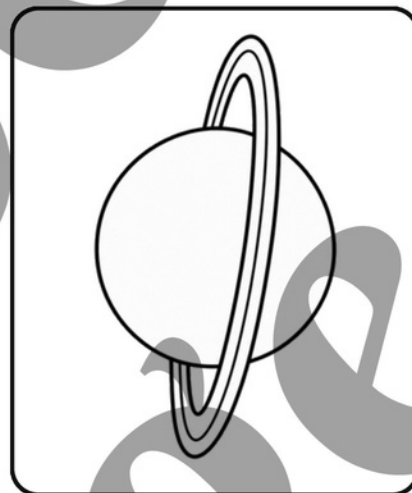
Sideways Uranus

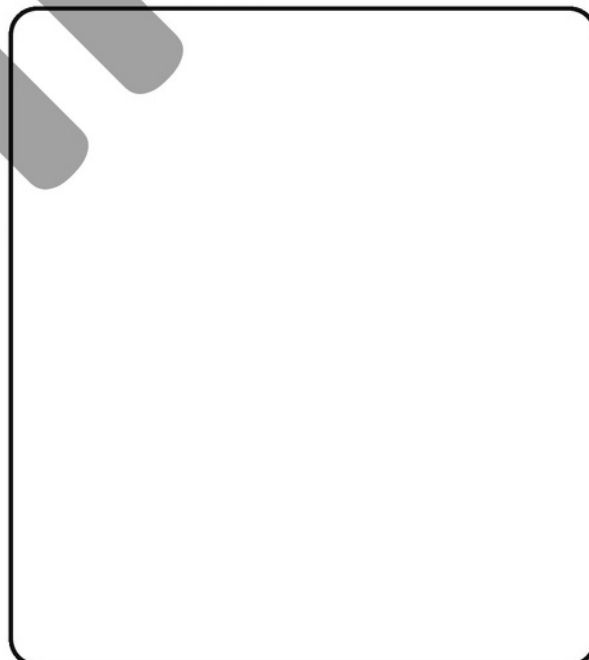

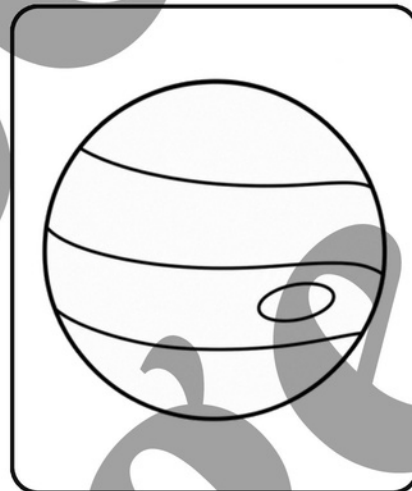
Faraway Neptune
